## **1. INVENTORY OF DEACCESSIONED AV MATERIALS**

In early 2024, inventory was completed of the deaccessioned AV materials from the National Library of Medicine. These fragile materials were moved into cold storage at Iron Mountain. This type of storage is critical for preserving items until they can be digitized and moved into more permanent storage.

A portion of the deaccessioned AV materials includes what we refer to as the MCV Tapes—videos recorded by Dr. Bowen during his time at the Medical College of Virginia (MCV)\*. These tapes capture a significant period in Dr. Bowen's professional work. Last year, TMBAP initiated project planning for the preservation and digitization of this important collection.

\*"Medical College of Virginia" was the original name for the medical campus of Virginia Commonwealth University (VCU), located in Richmond, VA, now known as the VCU Health.

# 2. THE SCHARA-DWYER ARCHIVAL RESEARCH SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

TMBAP's inaugural scholarship program was launched in the fall of 2024 with generous funding from current-serving (and founding) TMBAP Board members, Andrea Schara and Bill Dwyer. The program is a \$1,000, six-month research award to work with archival materials available through TMBAP's website. The 2024 scholarship recipient is Ms. Nailin Morera, an Outreach Adult Therapist at Women In Distress of Broward County, Inc. — a full service domestic violence center in Broward County, Florida — where she is dedicated to supporting survivors of domestic violence. She is also currently pursuing her Ph.D. in Couples and Family Therapy at Nova Southeastern University.

With the support of this scholarship, she will enhance her research through the use of Murray Bowen's archives. We know that this opportunity will greatly enrich her work moving forward and we are excited to see how she integrates information from the archives into her research.


We are also deeply grateful to Dr. Carrie Collier, who is providing mentorship to Ms. Morera and bringing meaningful support and guidance to her throughout the granting period.

A webinar is planned for September 2025 to showcase Ms. Morera's work, and we invite you to join us! The next scholarship application period will also open in the fall, and more details on both will be forthcoming.

#### **3. STRATEGIC PLANNING**

TMBAP met in Denver, Colorado in May 2024 for its first in-person strategic planning retreat since the pandemic. This retreat was spent developing strategies and identifying partners and resources to actualize the continued preservation and accessibility of the Murray Bowen Archives.

This process has involved parsing the roles that TMBAP will play, including assisting owners of archival materials in processing



their items. It also presented an opportunity to identify the path to actualizing the larger project of making the Murray Bowen Archives available to the world: a) the creation of an interactive digital library, with robust searchability, which will allow instant access to a wide range of archival materials, and b) assisting the Bowen family and Bowen Center in locating a physical repository for Dr. Bowen's materials within a dynamic, thriving institution committed to advancing research.

These strategies will make the archives accessible to a broad audience while making possible the advancement of scholarship to encourage continued research within the archives.

As part of this work, we began identifying top archivists and processing specialists skilled in preserving, organizing, digitizing, quality-checking, and publishing archival items.

## 4. THE 2024 ANNUAL TMBAP WEBINAR

TMBAP's webinar took place at the end of January 2024 in honor of Dr. Bowen's birthday and was well attended, with 133 registrants. The webinar focused on the archival collections owned by the Bowen Center. TMBAP Board members Priscilla Friesen, Amie Post, and Kent Webb all presented. The recording of this event is available to watch through TMBAP's website, Vimeo, and YouTube.

# **5. FUNDRAISING**

TMBAP fundraised \$48,800 in 2024. We would like to thank all of our donors for their contributions last year. Donor support makes the work of processing Dr. Bowen's archives possible.

We also implemented our annual fundraising campaign—a foundational effort that included four key email communications and increased donor acknowledgments, while laying the groundwork for aligning future giving opportunities with our strategic goals.

TMBAP will be announcing significant fundraising opportunities in 2025 to support our long-term goals for securing a physical repository for all archival items, and for developing a digital library that supports broad access and research capabilities.


## 6. TMBAP BOARD & STAFF UPDATES
